

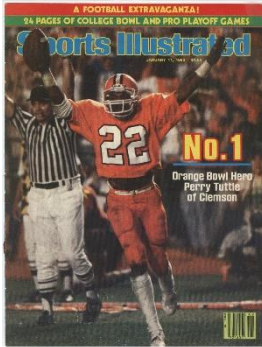
By the Numbers Bowl Edition

Welcome to the bowl edition of By the Numbers. Here you will find some commentary on each of the (41!) bowl games as well as the computer's picks. With more than a month off for some teams, a bowl game can be more like a first game of the year than the logical conclusion of the season, so the computer picks are not especially reliable.

The selection committee got lucky with a clear-cut choice of top four. My computer ratings agree on the top four, and the matchups, although the computer has shuffled the order at the top. It was a blast watching my Clemson Tigers go undefeated, although their habit of letting fourth quarter leads disintegrate did not help my blood pressure. It may not be very sporting, but I have no problem watching Clemson blow somebody out. For instance, last year's Russell Athletic Bowl where Clemson beat Oklahoma 40-6 was very enjoyable. Now, of course, I worry that it is giving OU some extra motivation for their semifinal game.

Here's a side-note that would only be of interest to Clemson fans. The only other time Clemson went into a bowl game #1 was the 1982 Orange Bowl, in which they faced the #4-ranked Big 12 champs. Clemson was an underdog, but won its only national championship. 34 years later, and the #1 team is again an underdog to the #4-ranked Big 12 champs.

I debated what to use for the background. Given the above trivia, a shot of Clemson's 1982 win seemed good, except that you may have already seen too much orange from me.



Another farewell-to-Beamer background? The Hokies are in a bowl for the 23rd straight year, a Beamer streak that starts and now ends in the Independence Bowl. Ohio State and Notre Dame have combined for 18 national championships and 14 Heisman winners. Southern Cal and Wisconsin played in the 1963 Rose Bowl, but despite the snazzy W's on the back of the Badger helmets the winner is the 1983 Penn State – Georgia Sugar Bowl, Paterno's first consensus national champion after many disappointments.

For each game, I list the computer's pick (no home field), TV information, and some unscientific and possibly useless comments. The final regular season ratings follow the picks. It looks like a good bowl season, with 25 of the 41 games predicted to be four-point differences or less.

12/19 Celebration NC A&T 31, Alcorn 21

12:00 ABC Atlanta

A battle of conference champions from the SWAC and the MEAC.

NC A&T (9-2): Only losses to UNC and NC Central.

Alcorn (9-3): Revenged an early loss to Grambling to earn this spot.

12/19 Cure Bowl San Jose State 24, Georgia State 23

12:00 CBSSN Orlando

Curing in the sun in Florida could make this game a bit jerky.

San Jose (5-7): Running back Tyler Ervin is a star. Offense is molded around QB Kenny Potter.

Georgia St (6-6): Won last 4 to get first bowl ever. Don't know if the coach can fall down like March Madness' Ron Hunter, but QB Nick Arbuckle threw for over 400 yards.

12/19 New Mexico Bowl Arizona 41, New Mexico 28

2:00 ESPN Albuquerque

A home game for New Mexico, a rededication game for a disappointing Arizona team.

Arizona (6-6): Coach Rod is staying, hoping to turn around 1-4 finish. QB Anu Solomon and a strong running attack lead the Wildcats, who battled injuries all year. 2-6 versus bowl teams.

New Mexico (7-5): Beat bowl teams in three of last four games. Strong running game, but you can bet on WR Dameon Gamblin to take a risk.

12/19 Las Vegas Bowl Utah 31, Brigham Young 23

3:30 ABC Las Vegas

A rivalry known as the Holy War, played in Vegas. Utah's Coach Whittingham is 8-1 in bowls, BYU's Bronco is on the road to Charlottesville. If the coach is a Hoo, you must pick the Utes.

Utah (9-3): The running of Devontae Booker, a stout defense, and the best punter, Tom Hackett.

BYU (9-3): QB Tanner Mangum started the year with a Hail Mary, led the Cougars to a 7-1 finish. RB Algernon Brown has blossomed.

12/19 Camellia Bowl Appalachian State 28, Ohio 21

5:30 ESPN Montgomery

The stadium is the Cramton Bowl; good choice on the name of the game. App has a long history of postseason success, but this is its first official bowl game.

App State (10-2): QB Taylor Lamb leads the slaughter, supported by 1000-yard RB Marcus Cox..

Ohio (8-4): AJ Ouellette challenges defenses and spell-check. Won last 3 after QB change.

12/19 New Orleans Bowl Arkansas State 38, Louisiana Tech 34

9:00 ESPN New Orleans

An interesting regional battle.

Ark State (9-3): QB Fredi Knighten led an offense that topped 50 points in last three games. WR Darron Griswold is ready for a nice vacation.

La Tech (8-4): Ex-Gator Jeff Driskel put up big numbers for the Bulldogs. 1-4 versus bowl teams.

12/21 Miami Beach **Western Kentucky 38, South Florida 35**

2:30 ESPN Miami

This promises to be a fun, high-scoring game.

WKU (11-2): QB Brandon Doughty threw for 4594 yards and 45 TDs! Why is he still unknown? Only losses were to LSU and Indiana.

USF (8-4): Won 7 of last 8. RB Marlon Mack ran for 1273, QB Quinton Flowers threw for 21 TDs and is backed up by Steven Bench. A name change might help.

12/22 Idaho Potato Bowl **Utah State 27, Akron 24**

3:30 ESPN Boise

Normally, I'd have zip to say about Akron (you knew I'd use the zip line) but they're in a bowl!

Utah St (6-6): Senior QB Chuckie Keaton is a legend, but after his injury Kent Myers was more efficient. Which one do you start? 3-6 versus bowl teams.

Akron (7-5): A return to coaching for Terry Bowden, leading Akron to its second bowl ever. Won last 4 games, but 0-5 versus bowl teams.

12/22 Boca Raton Bowl **Toledo 24, Temple 23**

7:00 ESPN Boca Raton

A nice resort location for a couple of blue collar teams.

Toledo (9-2): Kareem Hunt leads a punishing rushing attack. Beat Arkansas, Arkansas State, and Bowling Green, had trouble with the back end of the alphabet.

Temple (10-3): The Owls are led by Bednarik Award and Nagurski Award winner LB Tyler Matakevich. On offense, PJ Walker and Jahad Thomas lead the way. 4-3 versus bowl teams.

12/23 Poinsettia Bowl **Boise State 31, Northern Illinois 30**

4:30 ESPN San Diego

Two recent BCS busters have dropped a notch, but San Diego is a nice place to land.

Boise (8-4): QB Brett Rypien is a future star, Jeremy McNichols ran for 1244. 3-4 vs bowl teams.

NIU (8-5): Issues at QB after Drew Hare fell out, but Joel Bouagnon ran for 1269. Defense struggled in losses in 2 of last 3 games.

12/23 GoDaddy Bowl **Bowling Green 41, Georgia Southern 29**

8:00 ESPN Mobile

MAC champion Bowling Green against a traditional FCS power.

BG (10-3): Matt Johnson threw for 4700 yards and 43 TDs! Points and more points.

GS (8-4): Two QBs and Matt Breida lead the offense. 1-4 vs bowl teams.

12/24 Bahamas Bowl **Western Michigan 40, Middle Tennessee 31**

12:00 ESPN Nassau

Amazingly similar stats, and another high-scoring matchup.

WM (7-5): Zach Terrell threw for 27 TDs, Daniel Braverman caught 103 passes; 3-5 vs bowl teams

MT (7-5): Brent Stockstill threw for 27 TDs, Richie Jones caught 100 passes; won last four

12/24 Hawaii Bowl San Diego State 30, Cincinnati 28

8:00 ESPN Honolulu

This is a better game than Hawaii usually gets! The Aztecs are Mountain West champs.

San Diego (10-3): Won last 9 games, 5 against bowl teams. Donnel Pumphrey ran for 1554 yards and 16 TDs and caught 27 passes for 397 more yards.

Cincy (7-5): You'd have to believe the offense is good if the QB is named Gunner Kiel and the RB is named Hosey. 3-5 versus bowl teams.

12/26 St. Petersburg Marshall 19, Connecticut 17

11:00 ESPN St. Petersburg

A defensive struggle to start your day-after-Christmas bowl feast.

Herd (9-3): QB Chase Litton threw for 22 TDs. A 1-2 finish after winning 7 in a row.

UConn (6-6): Jamar Summers had 7 int's in last 8 games, including an upset of Houston.

12/26 Sun Bowl Miami 29, Washington State 28

2:00 CBS El Paso

Two great quarterbacks, Brad Kaaya versus Luke Falk.

Miami (8-4): Not a bad season, given that they fired the coach. 4-4 versus bowl teams, and competitive other than the Clemson and UNC debacles.

WSU (8-4): Mike Leach's offense works in the Northwest, too. Falk threw for 4266 yards, was on the Gabe Marks 99 times and only had a mild stutter with WR River Cracraft.

12/26 Dallas Bowl Washington 31, Southern Miss 21

2:30 ESPN Dallas

Which Washington team will you watch? Big Tex chooses the Huskies.

Wash (6-6): QB Jake Browning and Myles Gaskin try to blow out USM. 4-6 vs bowl teams

USM (9-4): Nick Mullens threw for over 4000 yards. Jalen Richards ran for over 1000 and ditto for Ito Smith. 1-4 versus bowl teams.

12/26 Pinstripe Bowl Indiana 41, Duke 40

3:30 ABC Bronx

Basketball powers playing football in a baseball stadium. Don't expect Knight/Coach K style D.

Indiana (6-6): QB Nate Sudfeld and RB Jordan Howard lead a strong offense. Sudfeld's backup Zander Diamont is a little rough. 1-5 versus bowl teams, with 2 OT heartbreaker vs Michigan

Duke (7-5): 4th straight bowl, but last win was in 1961. DeVon Edwards returned 3 kickoffs for TDs – the defense gives him lots of chances. Lost 4 of last 5.

12/26 Independence Bowl Virginia Tech 38, Tulsa 28

5:45 ESPN Shreveport

Here's hoping the Golden Hurricanes don't rain (or worse) on Beamer's retirement parade.

VT (6-6): Travon McMillian ran for 960 yards, and Isiah Ford and Bucky Hodges are good targets for Michael Brewer. The defense is led by Luther Maddy and a strong secondary.

Tulsa (6-6): Dane Evans threw for nearly 4000 yards, but the key might be on the ground with Keyarris Garrett. 1-5 versus bowl teams.

12/26 Foster Farms **UCLA 35, Nebraska 27**

9:15 ESPN **Santa Clara**

Looks like a big mismatch, but Nebraska lost several close games, starting with a Hail Mary to BYU and then suffering 4 losses by 3 or less. Huskers had trouble stopping the pass, though.

UCLA (8-4): Freshman QB Josh Rosen was as good as advertised. RB Paul Perkins is excellent, his backup SoSo. Kicker Ka'imi Fairbairn won the Groza Award.

Neb (5-7): Gave Michigan State its only loss, if you don't mind the blown out-of-bounds call. WR Jordan Westerkamp is hard to stop, QB Tommy Armstrong hard to predict.

12/28 Military Bowl **Navy 28, Pittsburgh 24**

2:30 ESPN2 **Annapolis**

A tough home game for Navy, and a tough draw for Pittsburgh, which narrowly lost to UNC.

Navy (10-2): QB Keenan Reynolds holds NCAA record with 85 rushing TDs, the Middies were 5-2 against bowl teams.

Pitt (8-4): A very good team defensively led online by Ejuan Price. Skilled players on offense include the versatile Tyler Boyd and Qadree Ollison.

12/28 Quick Lane Bowl **Minnesota 24, Central Michigan 20**

5:00 ESPN **Detroit**

Both teams had coaching health issues, but a bowl is a nice way to close out the season.

Minn (5-7): The Gophers were 1-7 versus bowl teams after losing Coach Jerry Kill.

CMU (7-5): QB Cooper Rush rarely runs, but threw for 3703 yards. 2-4 vs bowl teams.

12/29 Armed Forces **California 42, Air Force 28**

2:00 ESPN **Fort Worth**

Cal threw for 4425 yards, Air Force completed 80 passes all year. Air Force ran for 4183 yards, Cal for 1868. Contrasting styles in the Armed Forces Bowl.

Cal (7-5): Jared Goff threw for 37 TDs and the Bears averaged 37 pts per game.

AF (8-5): Weston Steelhammer needs to bring the pass D. 3-5 vs bowl teams.

12/29 Russell Athletics **North Carolina 42, Baylor 40**

5:30 ESPN **Orlando**

Two fantastic offenses. Baylor's issues have been bad Texas weather and injuries tot QBs 1, 2, and 3.

UNC (11-2): Marquise Williams threw for 2829 yards, ran for 867. Elijah Hood ran for over 1000. Only the South Carolina schools could beat the Heels.

Bay (9-3): The various QBs threw for 44 TDs. Corey Coleman won the Biletnikoff Award catching passes for 20 TDs! OT Spencer Drango won awards. Injuries cost the Bears a 1-3 finish.

12/29 Arizona Bowl **Colorado State 28, Nevada 24**

7:30 ASN **Tuscon**

A battle of Mountain West teams. And people say there are too many bowls!

CSt (7-5): Nick Stevens and Dalyn Dawkins lead a strong running game. Won last 4 games.

Nev (6-6): Odd stat: only Tyler Stewart threw a pass for the Wolves this year. Two 1000-yard runners and kicker Brent Zuzo (14 of 16 FGs) leading the nation in z's.

12/29 Texas Bowl **LSU 45, Texas Tech 36**

9:00 ESPN Houston

A restart for LSU. We love Coach Miles, nobody can hold Leonard Fournette under 200 yards, and all systems are geaux.

LSU (8-3): 7-0 then 0-3. Then Texas A&M and Tech. Fournette ran for 1741 yards and 18 TDs, but Alabama ruined his season.

TT (7-5): Not much D, but Patrick Majones threw for 4283 yards and DeAndre Washington ran for 1455. Hence the predicted score.

12/30 Birmingham Bowl **Memphis 35, Auburn 29**

12:00 ESPN Birmingham

It's been years since the Iron Bowl was played in Birmingham, but it's still a nice venue for Auburn, and not that far away for Memphis, which sends its coach to Virginia Tech.

Mem (9-3): Paxton Lynch is considered by many the best NFL QB prospect this year; 28 TDs and only 3 int's agree. Leading rusher has the great name Doroland Dorceus.

Aub (6-6): Disappointing year for Malzahn and crew, stemming from the lack of a Lynch-pin quarterback. 3-6 vs bowl teams.

12/30 Belk Bowl **Mississippi State 38, North Carolina State 30**

3:30 ESPN Charlotte

A good ACC-SEC matchup, with super-sized and efficient quarterbacks. No 20% off specials here.

Will the State fans make it a home game for the Wolf Pack?

MSU (8-4): Dak Prescott had 25 TDs against only 4 int's plus 541 yards and 10 TDs rushing.

NCS (7-5): Jacoby Brissett threw for 19 TDs against 4 int's.

12/30 Music City Bowl **Texas A&M 28, Louisville 23**

7:00 ESPN Nashville

ACC-SEC round 2. Two teams looking for their identity in Music City.

A&M (8-4): Trying to find the right QB away from Kyle Field: Allen, who is Kyle, or Murray, who is even Kyler. A 5-0 start (4 of them bowl teams) went thumbs down for the Aggies with a 3-4 end.

Ville (7-5): More QB issues; the Cards play three of them. Lamar Jackson was the team's leading rusher, which points to several problems. Won 5 of their last 6.

12/30 Holiday Bowl **Southern Cal 21, Wisconsin 19**

10:30 ESPN San Diego

Two classic programs after good but not great seasons. SC won the PAC-12 South, where 5 of 6 teams are going bowling (also true of the PAC-12 North, by the way).

USC (8-5): Cody Kessler had another big year with 3315 yards and 28 TDs, with JuJu Smith-Schuster on the receiving end 85 times. 6-5 against bowl teams in a loaded schedule.

Wisc (9-3): RB Taiwan Deal is as close to an action packed thriller as the Badgers get. Not the best Wisconsin team in recent years.

12/31 Peach Bowl Florida State 31, Houston 27

12:00 ESPN Atlanta

Florida State set a scoring record two years ago. Houston is the last FBS team to score 100 points in a game. Neither is likely to happen here, but it should be a fun matchup.

FSU (10-2): A destruction of Florida showed how good the Noles can be. Dalvin Cook is amazing. A blocked field goal vs Georgia Tech and a loss at Clemson the only blemishes for the team.

UH (12-1): QB Greg Ward threw for 16 TDs and ran for 1041 yards. Top WR is Chance Allen; a loss to UConn denied UH a chance at an unbeaten season, but didn't keep the Cougars out of a big bowl.

12/31 Orange Bowl Oklahoma 36, Clemson 34

4:00 ESPN Miami

The Orange Bowl in the afternoon? Semifinal #1: high-powered offenses, exciting QBs, and teams with chips on their shoulder: OU was bad last year, and #1 Clemson is an underdog.

OU (11-1): Walk on QB Baker Mayfield has been spectacular: 35 TDs vs 5 int's. Last year's sensation Semaje Perine ran for 1291, was shut down by Clemson last year.

CU (13-0): Deshaun Watson has won all of the QB awards. The defense will need fresh legs to keep up with the Sooners for 4 quarters.

12/31 Cotton Bowl Alabama 24, Michigan State 20

8:00 ESPN North Texas

Semifinal #2: hardnosed defenses, efficient QBs, and one team with a chip on its shoulder. Sparty does well as an underdog, but will need big games from the D and Connor Cook.

Bama (12-1): Loaded as always. Heisman winner Derrick Henry (1986 yards, 23 TDs), Rimington winner Ryan Kelly, Outland finalist A'shawn Robinson, and Nick Saban.

Sparty (12-1): Connor Cook is good, LJ Scott is a tough runner, but this team is all about pride and defense, as a loaded Ohio State team learned. One loss is right, but should have been to Michigan and not Nebraska.

1/1 Outback Bowl Northwestern 20, Tennessee 17

12:00 ESPN2 Tampa

New Year's Day starts with a matchup once dubbed SEC versus SAT.

NW (10-2): Beat Stanford, but bad losses to Michigan and Iowa cost them. Clayton Thorson throws bolts and Justin Jackson ran for 1344 yards, but the defense is the key.

UT (8-4): The Vols keep getting better, but its 5-game win streak did not include any bowl teams.

1/1 Citrus Bowl Michigan 21, Florida 18

1:00 ABC Orlando

Both teams over-achieved, as old dynasties try to come back to life.

Mich (9-3): QB Jake Rudock has good targets in Jehu Chesson and Jake Butt (with that name, you know that he is a tight end).

Fla (10-3): The Gators had to adjust back to Treon Harris after Will Grier's suspension. Lost last two games, and didn't look very good either time.

1/1 Fiesta Bowl **Ohio State 28, Notre Dame 24**

1:00 ESPN **Glendale**

A big-time matchup in the desert! The Buckeyes played their best game against Michigan, the Irish had narrow losses at Clemson and Stanford.

Ohio (11-1): Zeke Elliott (1672 yards) will demand the ball. Interesting that the next three leading rushers are Barrett, Miller, and Jones, the three QBs.

ND (10-2): DeShone Kiser did well as the new QB, with help from CJ Prosise and Will Fuller on offense and Butkus winner Jaylon Smith on defense.

1/1 Rose Bowl **Stanford 28, Iowa 27**

5:00 ESPN **Pasadena**

The Hawkeyes were a few seconds away from making the playoffs, but winning Iowa's first Rose Bowl since 1959 would be a nice consolation.

Stan (11-2): QB Kevin Hogan's last game. Heisman runner-up Christian McCaffrey is his hero, running for 1847 yards and catching passes for 540 more.

Iowa (12-1): CJ Beathard and Jordan Canzeri run an offense that is better than most think.

1/1 Sugar Bowl **Ole Miss 38, Oklahoma State 36**

8:30 ESPN **New Orleans**

The Rebels and the Cowboys. Each team had a clear road to the playoffs partway through the season, but neither finished the job.

Miss (9-3): May be without star DE Robert Nkemdiche. WR Laquon Treadwell gets lots of Adeboyejo's from his running mate.

OkSt (10-2): A 10-0 start, then ran into top ten teams Baylor and Oklahoma. QB Mason Rudolph threw for 3591 yards.

1/2 Gator Bowl **Georgia 21, Penn State 18**

12:00 ESPN **Jacksonville**

An interesting game that could go to the wire, but not likely to be high-scoring.

UGa (9-3): Virginia transfer Greyson Lambert threw for 11 TDs, but the offense struggled without Nick Chubb. Sony Michel topped 1000 yards, but was an inferior import.

PSU (7-5): This was to be Christian Hackenberg's breakout year, but 16 TDs doesn't break anything. 1-5 versus bowl teams. Lombardi winner Carl Nassib leads a tough defense.

1/2 Liberty Bowl **Arkansas 37, Kansas State 27**

3:30 ESPN **Memphis**

Two teams that made nice comebacks, the Hogs from a 2-4 start and K-State from 3-6.

Ark (7-5): Mackey Award winner Hunter Henry makes life easier for QB Brandon Allen. Won 5 of last 6 to get this almost-home game.

KSt (6-6): Morgan Burns returned four kickoffs for touchdowns. I should mention FB Glenn Gronkowski – no good reason, but his brother gets headlines for no good reason, so ...

1/2 Alamo Bowl

TCU 45, Oregon 41

6:45 ESPN San Antonio

Wow! If Trevone Boykin and Vernon Adams are healthy, this could be unbelievable.

TCU (10-2): Boykin threw for 3575 yards and 31 TDs in basically 10 games, one without the great Josh Doctson. Only lost to the Oklahomas. A problem with the letter O?

Ducks (9-3): Adams threw for 25 TDs in 8 games. The Ducks flew for 49 points per game in their last five with Adams at QB.

1/2 Cactus Bowl

West Virginia 34, Arizona State 27

10:15 ESPN Tempe

And bowl #41! WVU on the road again, something they might be used to, playing in the Big 12.

WVU (7-5): Wendell Smallwood ran for 1447 yards. 2-5 versus bowl teams.

ASU (6-6): Mike Bercovici threw for 3442 yards and 26 TDs, 4-6 against bowl teams.

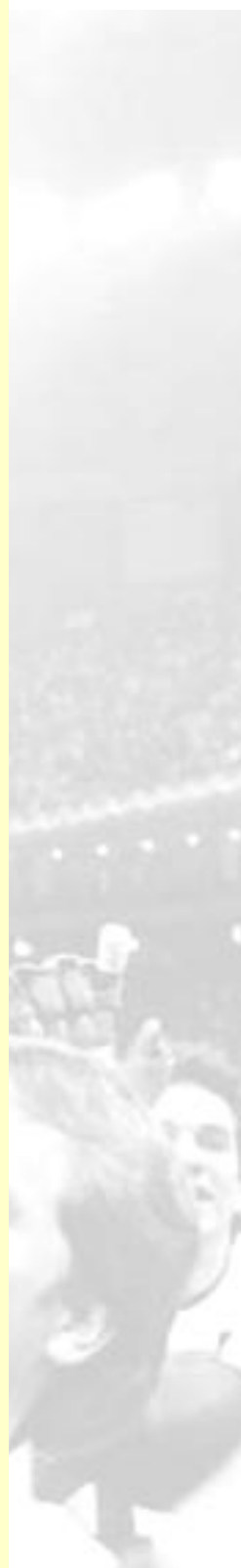

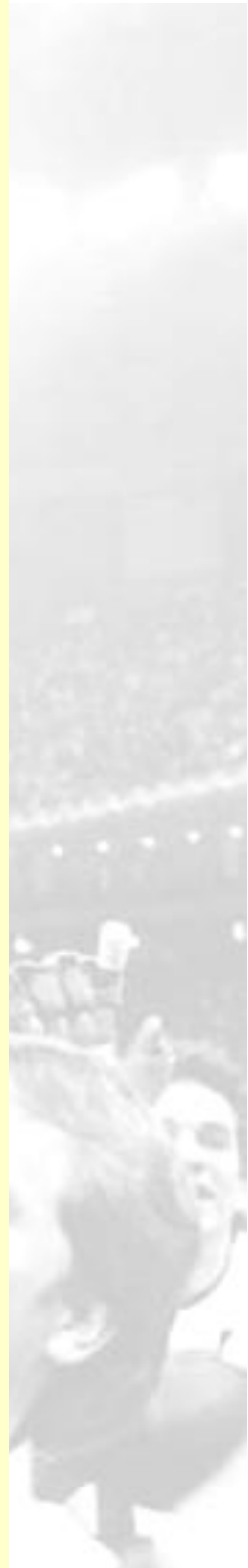
